


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JULY 2017



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AMEB Victoria's Conferring of Diplomas Ceremony took place on 21 March in The Wilson Hall, at the University of Melbourne. The ceremony recognises the achievements of outstanding young musicians who were successful in the Licentiate in Music, Australia (LMusA), the Associate in Music, Australia (AMusA), and the Rockschool Diploma in Music Performance.

AMusA — Of the 109 candidates awarded the Associate Diploma in 2017, 15 were awarded with Distinction in Cello, Classical Guitar, Flute, Piano, Trumpet, Saxophone and Violin.

LMusA — There were 29 Licentiate Diplomas awarded in 2017, of which 6 were awarded with Distinction in Cello, Piano and Violin. Three of the diplomates who received LMusA performed during the ceremony: Jun-Rae Cho on Clarinet; Richard Liu on Piano and Matthew Frampton the first Musical Theatre Licentiate.


AMEB Victoria's new online service centre

AMEB Connect has been upgraded! AMEB Victoria's new online service centre will allow registered users to:

- Enrol candidates for examinations and evaluations
- See provisional examination dates
- View and print Notices of Examination, and email them to candidates
- View and print examination reports, and email them to candidates
- Purchase AMEB publications and other resources
- Update personal details (such as change of email address, postal address, or phone number)

As part of the upgrade, there will be cosmetic changes to the presentation of examination reports, to facilitate scanning into AMEB Connect. Reports will be uploaded onto AMEB Connect and available to download, print or email within two weeks of a metropolitan examination and three weeks of a regional examination.

New users may register for AMEB Connect at any time by following the link on the AMEB Victoria website. Existing users will be asked to log in with their email address and AMEB Connect password.



Enrolling for exams through AMEB Connect is quick and easy. Details for previously-enrolled candidates can be quickly located through the search function. Payment for exams can be made by credit/debit card via a secure online payment site hosted by NAB (no card details are retained by the system). AMEB Victoria will continue to receive enrolments by post (with payment by cheque or money order) or in person at our office in Hawthorn.

The first AMEB Singing Scholarships awarded









AMEB is delighted to announce that four singing students from rural Victoria have been awarded the first ever AMEB Singing Scholarships. The scholarships will fund travel and accommodation for each student, their teacher and a chaperone to travel to Melbourne to receive support and guidance from leading teachers.

To be eligible for a scholarship the applicants needed to achieve an 'A' or 'A+' in an AMEB Singing or Singing for Leisure exam at Grade 4 or above in 2016. Two of the scholarship recipients, Nic Collins and Aurora Harmathy are taking VCE music exams this year and aim to study at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music next year.

Nicholas is from Ballarat and sees the scholarship as a sign that he is stepping in the right direction on his way to becoming an opera singer in the future. Both he and Aurora, who is from Leopold, are excited to be given the opportunity to work with teachers from the Conservatorium before their VCE recital and University auditions.

Tiffany Tracey from Warrnambool said: "I'm very excited and look forward to heading to Melbourne to attend lessons. It opens up opportunities for me to learn from professionals and specialists in the field."

Whatever she does in the future, Matilda Oram says singing and performing will always be integral part of her life. When discussing the singing masterclass, which will take place in October, she says, "I feel very privileged to be a part of such an incredible scholarship program to learn new skills and techniques, and I'm excited to see where it can take me."

Piano Associate Exam Preparation Workshop

AMEB Federal Diploma Examiners Mark McGee and Elizabeth Mitchell will discuss the attributes of a successful Associate Piano examination performance. AMEB Piano Scholarships for 2018

In 2018, Piano scholarships will be offered to encourage the development of Piano students who:

- Live in regional and rural Victoria (3-6 scholarships).
 OR
- 2. Identify as being from Indigenous backgrounds (3-6 scholarships).

The scholarship program aims to advance the knowledge and skills of students and their teachers in relation to technical and artistic aspects of music performance at AMEB Level 2.

The scholarships will fund travel and accommodation for selected students, each accompanied by a chaperone and a teacher, to participate in a weekend masterclass and workshop led by specialist teachers, to be held in April 2018 in Melbourne.

Scholarship applications

- Applicants must have achieved the result of 'A' or 'A+' in an AMEB examination in a Piano exam at Grade 5 or a higher Grade (including Certificate of Performance) in 2017.
- b. Applicants must be aged 18 years or under as at 31 December 2017.
- c. Three to six scholarships will be awarded to students who identify as being Indigenous.
- d. Three to six scholarships will be awarded to students from 'regional and rural' Victoria who are normally resident more than 60km from the Melbourne GPO.
- e. Applications for the 2018 Program close on 16 December 2017 and the Masterclass will take place in April 2018.
